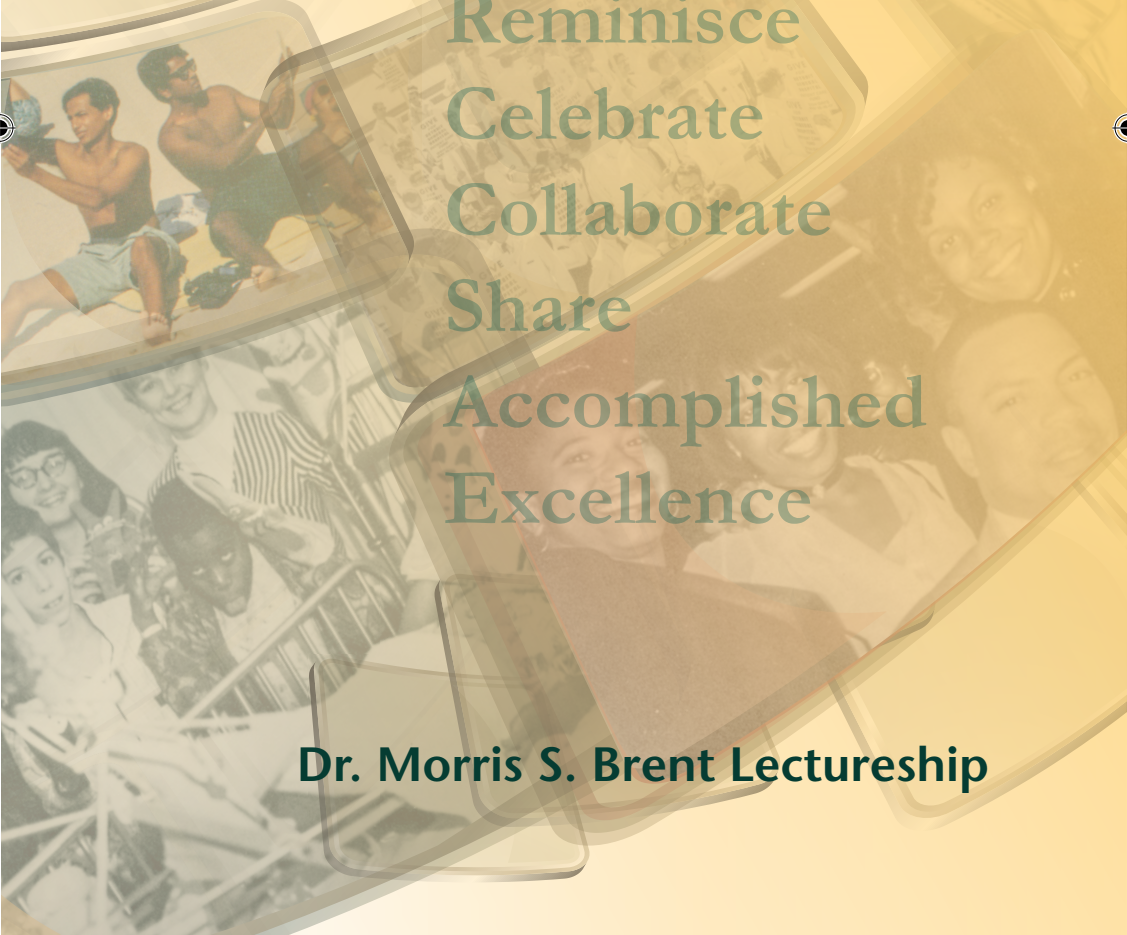

## The Dr. Morris S. Brent Lectureship

The Dr. Morris S. Brent Lectureship was established at the Wayne State University School of Medicine in 1989 by Brent General Hospital in honor of the late Morris S. Brent, M.D., to provide quality lecturers for continuing medical education during Medical Alumni Reunion Day. Dr. Brent grew up in Detroit, attended Cass Technical High School and received two degrees from Wayne State University, a bachelor's degree in 1927 and a medical degree in 1931.

He spent much of his career in general practice, specializing in surgery and obstetrics. In 1942, he founded Brent General Hospital, a non-profit corporation, and served as its administrator until his retirement. He married Anne, a dental hygienist, and they had two sons. Both sons became doctors, Burton Brent, a graduate of Chicago Medical School, and Robert Brent, a graduate of the WSU School of Medicine in 1960.

You will not want to miss the Dr. Morris S. Brent Lectureship, which will take place in the Margherio Family Conference Center. ##### **Did you know a Wayne State University School of Medicine startup was acquired recently for \$60 million?**

Dublin, Ireland-based pharmaceutical company Allergan plc acquired WSU startup RetroSense Therapeutics LLC for \$60 million. The company focuses on novel gene therapy, RST-001, aimed at restoring vision in patients suffering from blindness caused by retinitis pigmentosa, a technology developed by Zhuo-Hua Pan, Ph.D, the Edward T. and Ellen K. Dryer Endowed Professor of Ophthalmology, and of Anatomy and Cell Biology, and scientific director of the Ligon Research Center of Vision/Kresge Eye Institute.

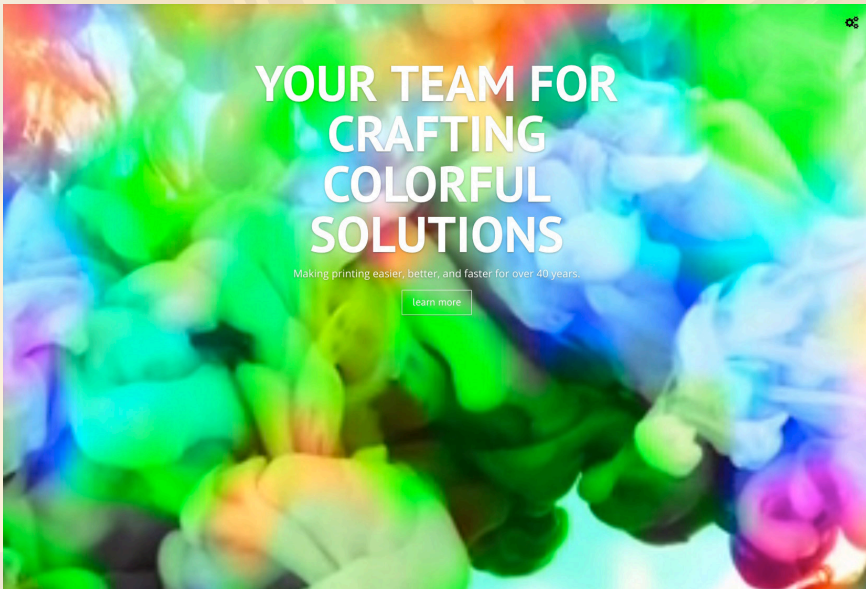

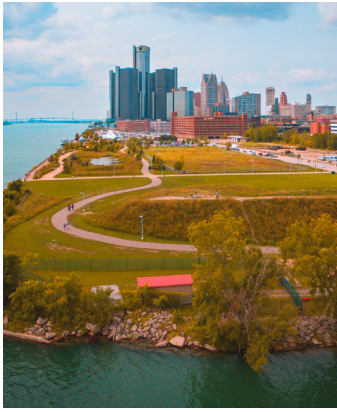

**APRIL 7 IS WORLD HEALTH DAY - Did you know of Lawrence Brilliant, M.D., a world leader and expert in global infectious diseases?** Dr. Brilliant graduated from the School of Medicine in 1969. He became chief executive officer of the Skoll Global Threats Fund, confronting global threats imperiling humanity. He founded the Seva Foundation, an international non-government organization overseeing programs that have restored sight to more than 3 million. He became a member of the four-person team that led the successful World Health Organization smallpox eradication program in India and South Asia.

**George Mogill, MD** is a Detroit legend. Dr. Mogill is a graduate of Detroit's Northern High School, received a BS from Wayne State University, and earned his medical degree from Wayne State University School of Medicine ("WSU-SOM"). A WWII veteran, a physician, teacher, and mentor, he is loved and respected by former patients, students, and colleagues. After completing one year of a surgical residency, Dr. Mogill joined the US Army Medical Corps and landed at Normandy with the 8<sup>th</sup> Field Hospital.

After WWII, he returned to Detroit and learned that his residency was no longer available to him. He joined the Staff of Grace Hospital (which was located in the medical center) and opened an office nearby, in what is now referred to as "Midtown". As a member of the Department of Family Practice, Dr. Mogill welcomed students into his daily life and office until he retired at the age of 92. He established the *George Mogill Award in Family Medicine* which is presented to Wayne graduates entering into a residency in family practice.

Dr. Mogill was awarded a *Lifetime Achievement Award* from both the Michigan Academy of Family Practice and the WSU-SOM. Additionally, he received the *Exemplary Teaching Award* from the American Academy of Family Practice.
